## Point Your Nose Where You Want To Go

Vision is so basic to everyday life that it's easy to overlook your eyes' true potential. Eyes for the most part dart around, randomly picking up signals for us to direct our attention. A a motorcyclist SIGHT is your secret weapon. Consciously controlling vision leads to a higher level of skill and enjoyment.

From basic training through professional racing, riders are taught that vision is crucial to directional control. How many times have you heard me or another instructor say "just look where you want to go." As if it was that easy, right?

For better or worse, when we focus on a certain spot we tend to head in that direction. This is called "target fixation." The term is commonly associated with a crash or going where you didn't want to go. When a rider goes too fast into a corner, pacis may cause them to stare at the guardrail rather than the exit of the curve. Their target fixation could cause them to end up right where they are looking—Not good!

Target fixation is at the heart of directional changes. Not all directional changes are unexpected due to a loss of concentration. We must have a target to ride correctly. Controlling our gaze directs the body and motorcycle to arrive at precise locations on purpose.

Because of this emphasis to look where you want to go, riders may go overboard and lock their stare on the corner exit or a full block down the road. This results in giving up valuable surveillance of the peripheral environment. The fear of veering off line might cause resistance to breaking the target focus.

Move those eyes. The best riders systematically scan and sweep their full field of vision ... constantly scanning and sweeping in an orderly visual search pattern is the proper technique. To do this you have to have a plan on where you want to go. Point your nose in that direction. As you focus on your target, scan and sweep your entire field of view using this pattern—straight ahead, sweep left, straight ahead, sweep right, straight ahead, check mirrors, straight ahead, etc. Direct your eyes to look for road hazards and characteristics.

At first, this excessive movement of your eyes may take some effort. But over time it will become automatic. Don't just assume that your vision will pick up vital information. Use it to proactively provide feedback so you can ride with full confidence.

Once you get good at eye control, you will develop an intuition of where both danger and enjoyment exist.



Come participate with us and have some fun.



## **Chapter L Ride Rating System**

#### First Gear Ride.

Mostly four lane roads. Some fairly straight two lane roads. No Interstates.

#### Second Gear Ride.

Two lane roads that are straight or may have gentle curves. Some four lane roads are possible. No Interstates.

#### Third Gear Ride.

Mostly two lane roads with gentle to moderate curves. Some four lane roads are possible.

#### Fourth Gear Ride.

Mostly two lane roads with moderate to aggressive curves. Some Interstate roads may be planned.

#### Fifth Gear Ride.

Mostly Interstate route or route may have very aggressive curves.

### Please, Please, Please RSVP



**RSVP**: This is an ongoing issue. If you receive a request email or text for your participation or support, we ask that everyone at least respond to the requestor with a yes/no/maybe. Leaving them in limbo is frustrating to say the least.

**IMPORTANT**: If we have planned a ride and you have not responded or do not meet us at the departure point but do show up at what was the original destination, you may be there alone. We could possibly change the ride destination if we have what we understand to be all participants at the departure point.

We also need to know in advance how many are attending to alert the eatery on how many to expect. Arriving with more or less could cause undue expense for the eatery.



## How to have FUN at a Rally!




# What's a Riding Poker Run and How Do I Participate?

The riding poker run will be a part of the Georgia Wing Fling Rally in June 2017. Right now it is scheduled for 10:00 am to 2:00 pm on Friday (check final schedule). This ride is sponsored by Rider Education and GA Chapter L in Rome.

The ride is self-guided. You can go anytime as long as you are back by 2:00 pm. It is 60 miles of scenic riding, which takes about 1-1/2 hours to complete. In order to participate, sign up at the Rider Education table in the lower concourse. The cost is \$5 to play. Pick up your map and ride. That's it! Almost. You need to study the map, and it will direct you to 4 locations on the ride. At the first location you pick up a token (may be a bean or button or such). Then, ride to the second, third and fourth locations and pick up a different token at each place. When you have all 4 tokens return to the Rider Education Table and pick your poker hand.

The money for participating will be placed in a 50/25/15/10 drawing. 25% for Best Hand; 15% for 2nd Best Hand; and 10% for worst hand. Encourage your friends to ride the Poker Run! The more money in the kitty, the more you can win!




